

About the Workshop:

Schools play a key role in the lives of children, and those who are working in schools are in a unique position to notice if something isn't right with a child. It is vital to be able to recognise physical signs and behavioural indicators that children may be living with abuse or neglect.

Also we all need to know what to do if they are worried about a child, where to go to get help and have the confidence to take appropriate action to protect children.

This workshop focuses on creating a safe school environment by providing participants with the tools and knowledge to protect children in their care.

- The context of child abuse in New Zealand.
- The different types of child abuse and neglect.
- The indicators and signs of child abuse and neglect.
- The Vulnerable Children Act and implications for Schools.
- The importance of effective Child Protection Policies, procedures, and safety check requirements for schools.
- Collaborative approaches to child protection.
- The impact of child abuse on educational outcomes.

This workshop will involve small and large group discussion, lecture and case studies.
