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# About Child Matters

Child Matters is a national charitable trust that exists to upskill those working and interacting with children, young people, and their families and whānau so that they can identify risks concerning vulnerability and abuse and have the knowledge and confidence to take appropriate action.

**Our purpose** is effecting change to prevent abuse and neglect.

Child Matters are national experts in child protection and safeguarding, and provide tailored support to individuals, community groups, and Government organisations. Child Matters uses a child-centric, evidence-based and trauma-informed approach, grounded in culturally responsive practice that is reflective of the diverse cultural contexts of children, whānau, and communities.

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# Course overview

# Overview

Child Protection in Practice is a six-week Level 3 NZQA certified micro-credential. Delivered by Child Matters, this course provides practical professional education in child protection and advocacy.

The purpose of this course is to build on existing foundational knowledge and skills for those working with children and young people. Participants will explore the wider context of child abuse in Aotearoa and strengthen their understanding of child protection practice, immediately applicable to their mahi.

Participants will gain the skills and confidence necessary to support safe practice within their organisation and contribute appropriately to the wider child protection system.



# Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this micro-credential, learners will be able to:

- Apply knowledge of the social, cultural, and systemic context of child abuse and family violence in Aotearoa, to identify and explain risk, vulnerability, protective and resilience factors relevant to their workplace setting.
- Apply child-centred and trauma-informed principles in practice, including recognising the impact of trauma and ACEs on development and behaviour.
- Respond appropriately to child protection concerns using best practice guidelines, including managing disclosures, documenting accurately, and escalating concerns appropriately.
- Apply knowledge of relevant child protection legislation and information-sharing provisions to workplace scenarios.



# Who is this course designed for?

- Anyone who has completed foundational child protection training and is looking to upskill further.
- Kaimahi holding the role of Designated Person for Child Protection or Child Protection Lead within their organisation.
- Those already working with or hoping to enter roles working with children and/or young people.
- Kaimahi wishing to develop their knowledge and skills in practical, applicable child protection responses.

# Delivery

Child Protection in Practice follows a blended learning approach. Learners will be required to complete four self-paced eLearning modules, covering theory-based readings and activities. We estimate these modules take learners approximately six hours to complete, over the course of five weeks.

Learners will then attend a 2-day in-person workshop, designed to embed learnings from the eLearning modules, taking theory into practice.

Assessments will be undertaken during the 2-day workshop.



# Course dates

Child Protection in Practice will be delivered in eight locations around the motu in 2027.

Cohorts are centred around the 2-day workshop; learners will register for the workshop date and location that suits them best and will then be given access to the eLearning modules.

# Fees

Fees are \$825 + GST per learner.

# How to apply

# Application process

## 1. ONLINE APPLICATION

Complete the online application form on the Child Matters website.

## 2. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

You will be asked to submit proof of NZ citizenship or residency\* (NZ Birth Certificate, NZ Passport, or overseas passport and eligible Visa documentation). You will also need to provide proof of completion of foundational child protection training (details overleaf).

\*Unfortunately, we are currently unable to accept international learners, unless on a Work Visa and the course is required by their employer (a supporting letter is required).



# Application process (continued)

## 2A. PROOF OF FOUNDATIONAL TRAINING (PRE-REQUISITE)

Prior to completing the Child Protection in Practice course, learners must have completing one of the below foundational child protection courses, and provide proof (usually a certificate) of having completed it within the 2 years prior to registration.

Approved foundational courses:

- Child Protection Essentials: Identify, Respond, Report (Child Matters)
- Introduction to Child Protection (Child Matters)
- Fundamentals of Safeguarding and Child Protection (Safeguarding Children)
- Safeguarding and Child Protection Seminar (Safeguarding Children)

# Application process (continued)

## 3. APPLICATION IS REVIEWED

Upon receiving your application and supporting documentation, the Child Matters team will review your application and we will let you know whether you have been accepted onto the course.

## 4. REGISTRATION

If your application is approved, you will be sent an email requesting you create a registration\*, which gathers information to be used for auditing and reporting purposes. During this process, you will also create an order, which generates an invoice for your fees to be sent to you.

\* Please note, you will only receive the invitation to create a registration 6 weeks before the 2-day workshop date, to ensure the eLearning is completed close to the workshop dates, and information is fresh in your mind.
